About us

Lewisham Music is an award-winning youth charity dedicated to transforming young lives through music. By providing inclusive access to creative opportunities, we empower young people aged 6–30 to reach their full potential, fostering stronger, healthier communities. Through our diverse range of music programmes, we harness the power of music to inspire, connect, and create lasting positive change. We work with professional music facilitators and mentors to deliver high-quality creative learning programmes—these range from school-based group learning to our flagship mental health programme, Sonic Minds. Our team includes professionals from education, the music industry, community engagement, and youth development, ensuring a holistic and impactful approach.

Lewisham Music has deep-rooted partnerships with local organisations in housing, education, children's services, and the voluntary sector. As a Principal Partner in the South-East London Music Hub, we collaborate with organisations across Lewisham and beyond to create high-quality opportunities for young people.

Last year, our charity delivered a diverse range of creative activities supporting over 5,500 children and young people across 80+ Lewisham schools, community settings and from The Fellowship, our state-of-the-art community music venue situated in the heart of the Bellingham Estate.

What we do

Learning and skills

Lewisham Music is dedicated to giving every child and young person the chance to learn, create, and progress in music. We support young musicians by providing access to instruments, expert tuition, and performance opportunities. Through a wide range of programmes in schools and the community, including instrumental lessons, ensembles, music technology, songwriting, and rap, we help young people develop their skills and confidence. Lewisham Music also offers inclusive access to resources, live events, creative holiday programmes, and partnerships with professional organisations, ensuring that music is accessible to all.

Community impact

Lewisham Music is committed to equity, wellbeing, and youth voice. We prioritise removing barriers to music education by offering bursaries, mentoring, and personalised support. Our work is shaped by young people's needs and ideas, creating safe, accessible spaces for self-expression and social connection. Through initiatives like co-production opportunities, paid roles for Young Producers, and community-focused music programmes, Lewisham Music celebrates local culture and history. We also champion positive mental health through music, with award-winning programmes like Sonic Minds, helping young people thrive emotionally and creatively.

Creative Careers

Lewisham Music supports young people in Lewisham to pursue careers in the creative industries by offering mentoring, training, and real-world experiences. Through programmes like Creative Futures, podcasting workshops, and Radio Lewisham, we help young people build industry skills, connect with professionals, and access both voluntary and paid opportunities. Our work focuses on breaking down barriers, raising awareness of career paths, and inspiring the next generation of creative professionals.

Sector support

Lewisham Music strengthens the local music and creative sector by working in partnership with schools, charities, and arts organisations. We provide professional development, training, and consultancy to build a skilled and confident music education workforce. By offering networking opportunities, space at The Fellowship, and tailored support for smaller organisations, we help create more opportunities for young people. Our collaborative approach includes joint fundraising, capacity building, and hosting community-focused initiatives to ensure a vibrant, inclusive local music ecosystem.

The difference you make

Right now, in Lewisham the opportunities for children to engage in music are uneven and all too often dependent family income. We have the highest proportion of children and young people (29.6%) living in economic deprivation in England.

Without our support many of Lewisham's young people will not get access to equal musical opportunities. Through our tailored programme of learning, events, projects and mentoring...we are here to change this!

1 in 5 young people are likely to have a mental health condition, up from 1 in 9 in 2017 (NHS Digital, November 2023).

We believe young people have the solutions to this crisis, and to truly understand and help their mental health, we need to work closely with them, empowering them to have a voice and be heard.

"Growing up, I had a lot of mental health issues, feeling unwanted, feeling like there was no place for me society. When I was like 8, I wrote my first song. I just remember spending the whole day writing it. In that moment, it just took me to another place. All this stuff that's happening around me didn't matter."

Hear our young people share how creativity supports their mental health: <u>A Big</u> Conversation

£100 — Covers instrument hire for a young musician for a year

£500 – Delivers a week-long music & wellbeing programme

£1,500 — Supports a term of industry mentoring for emerging artists

£3,000 - Funds a community performance project for 30+ young people

Ways to fundraise

Gift Aid

 Don't forget to add Gift Aid to your donation, this means we receive an extra 25% on top of anything you donate! Gift Aid is a simple way for charities to increase the value of gifts of money received from UK taxpayers. When you make a Gift Aid donation, the charity can claim back the tax that you have paid on the donation. This government scheme is called Gift Aid and amounts to an extra 25p for every £1 that you give in qualifying donations.

Every fundraiser = more access, more music, more positive change.

Sharing and promoting your campaign

There are several ways to let people know about your event to increase participation and donations.

Social media

Promote your event across your social media channels such as Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, TikTok, LinkedIn, YouTube, and WhatsApp

Flyers & posters

You can opt for paper or e-versions, make sure to include all relevant information about the event and how to donate.

Friends, family, & local buzz

Spread the word about your event to schools, venues, community centres, friends and family, and let them know what inspired you to fundraise and how to donate.

Foundation (CAF)

Legal stuff

Charity fundraising is regulated by law. We hope that by adhering to the guidelines below, you will have a safe and successful event.

Licensing

Your event may require a license for alcohol or entertainment, hosting a raffle or auction, public money collection or posting signs in public areas. Please ensure you consult your local council.

Insurance & risk

Your event may require insurance. Ensure that any insurance policies required by law are in place. You must make sure you have sufficient third-party public-liability cover in place and consider if any other insurance is necessary. It is also important to carry out a risk assessment before holding any size event.

The most up to date health and safety measures must also be adhered to during your event.

Collecting donations

- Keep checks and bank details in a safe and secure place
- When counting money, ensure two people are present
- Record collections as soon as possible

Use secure platforms like: JustGiving, CAF Donate, GoFundMe
